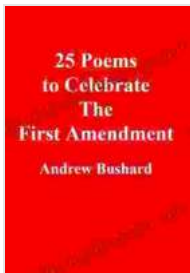

on the grass..."*



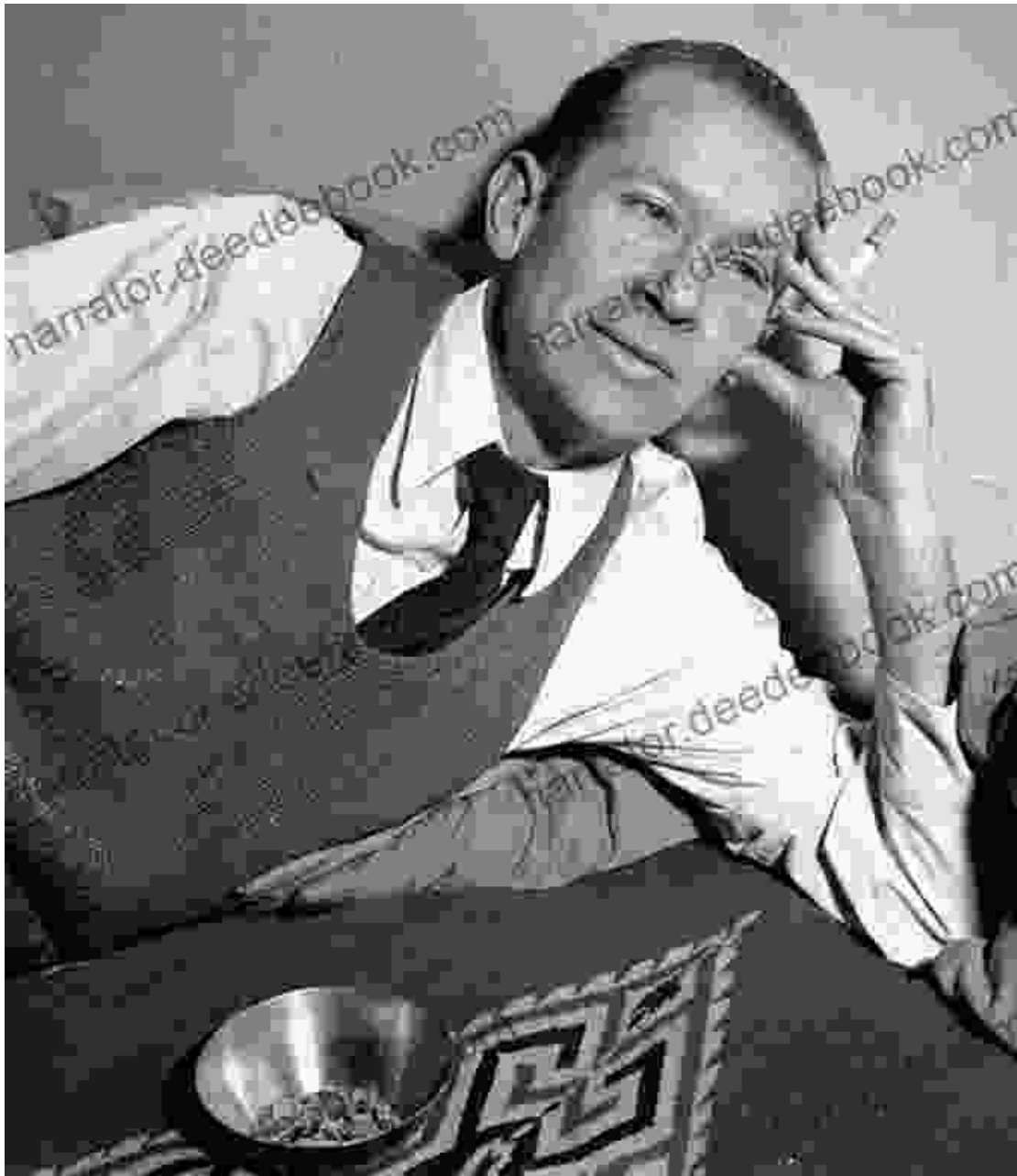

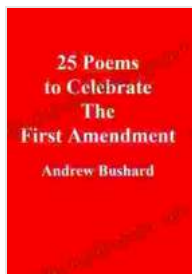

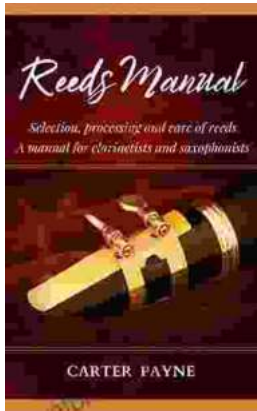
