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## Materials

## **Instructions**

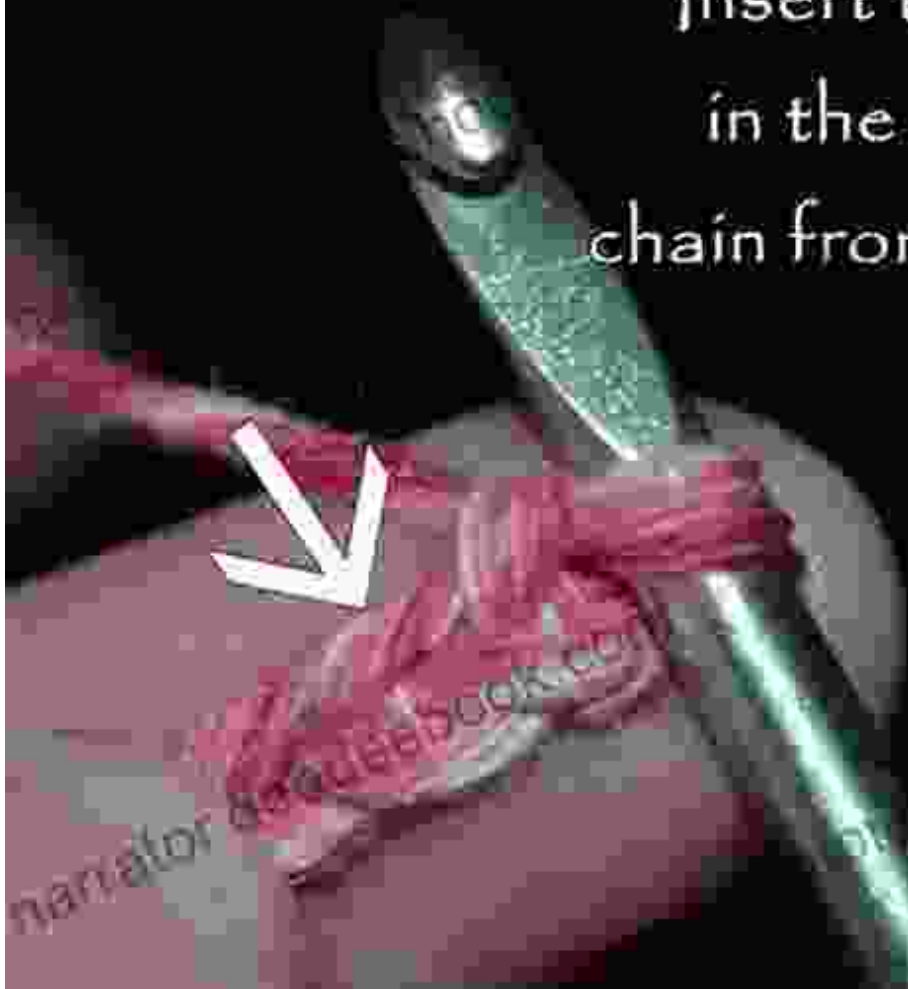
### **Round 1**

Make a slip knot and place it on your hook. Chain 5 (counts as a stitch).



Turn your work and insert your hook into the back loop of the second chain from the hook. Yarn over and pull up a loop.

Insert the hook  
in the second  
chain from the hook.



Yarn over and pull through both loops on your hook.



Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make 3 more single crochet stitches (sc) in the remaining chains.



Join the round with a slip stitch (sl st) in the top of the first sc.



**Round 2**

Chain 3 (counts as a dc).

Insert your hook into the same stitch as the sl st. Yarn over and pull up a loop.





Yarn over and pull through two loops on your hook.



Yarn over and pull through the remaining two loops on your hook.



You have now completed a double crochet stitch (dc). Make 2 more dc in the same stitch.

# HOW TO CROCHET


## Simple Illustrated Instructions

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### DOUBLE CROCHET (DC)


A commonly used stitch for crochet patterns.

**STEP 1**




Wrap yarn - insert hook in work - wrap yarn again and draw through work

**STEP 2**




Wrap yarn again and only pull through two loops on hook

**STEP 3**



Wrap yarn once again and pull through last two loops on hook

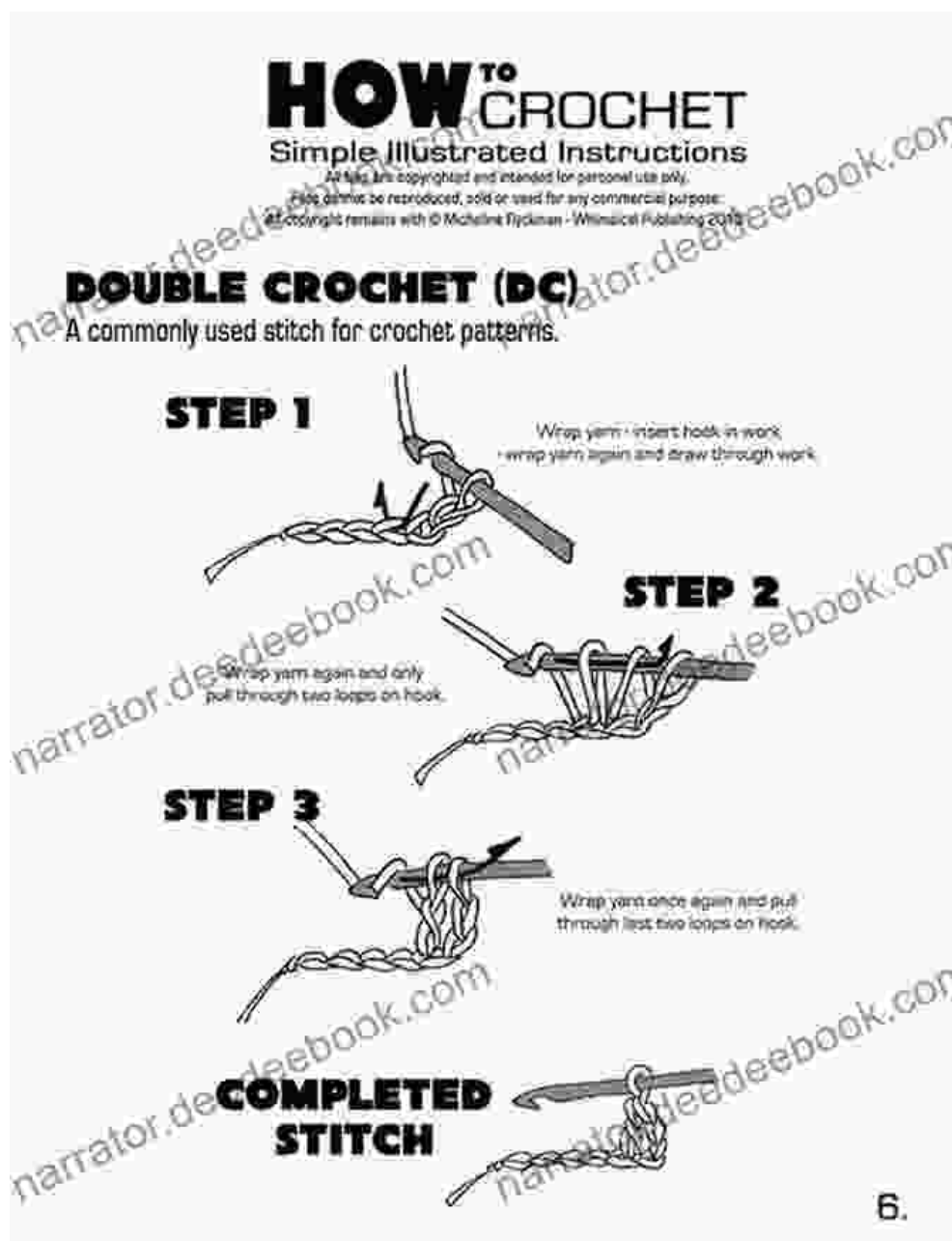
**COMPLETED STITCH**



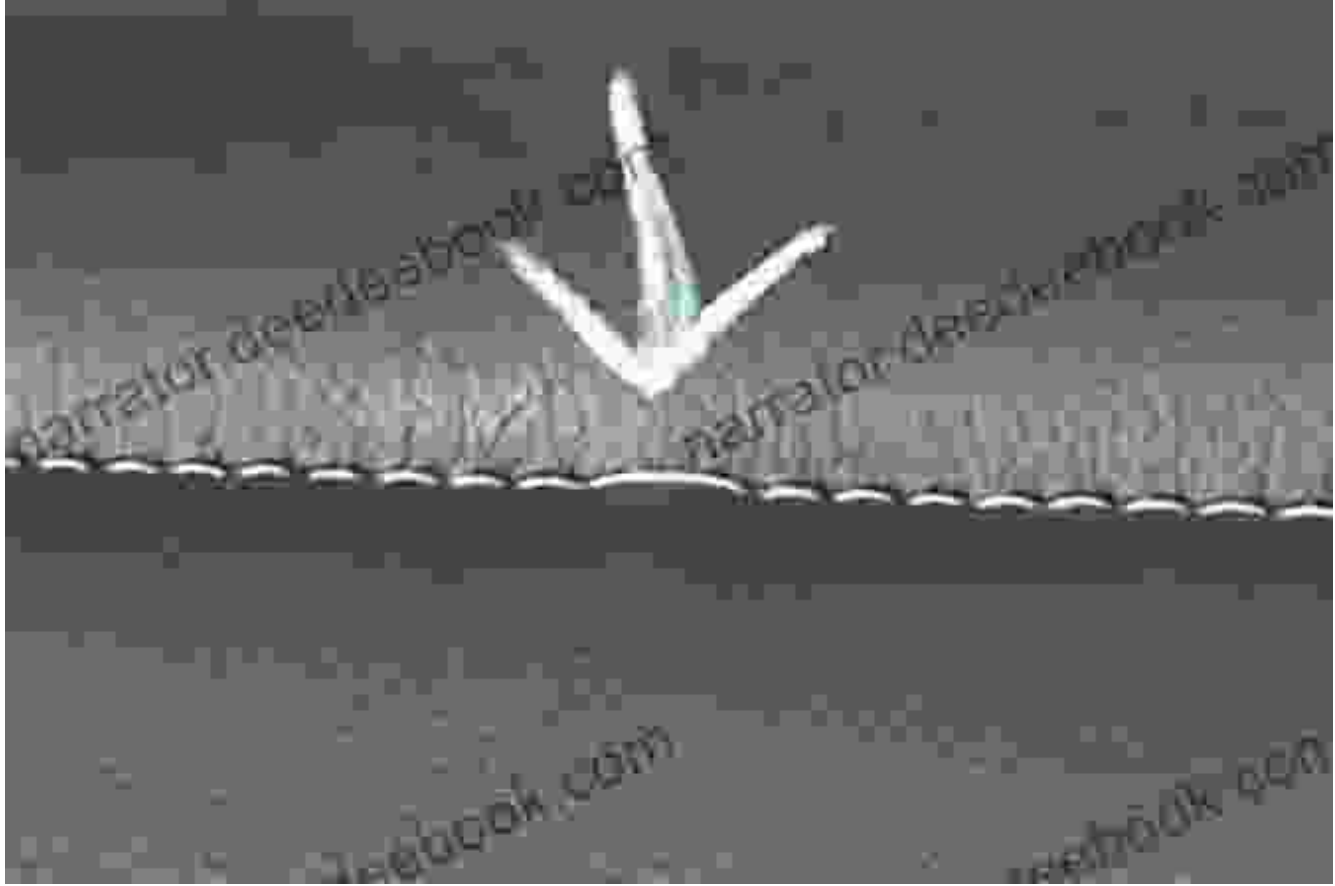
Skip the next stitch. Insert your hook into the next stitch and make 3 dc.



Chain 1.

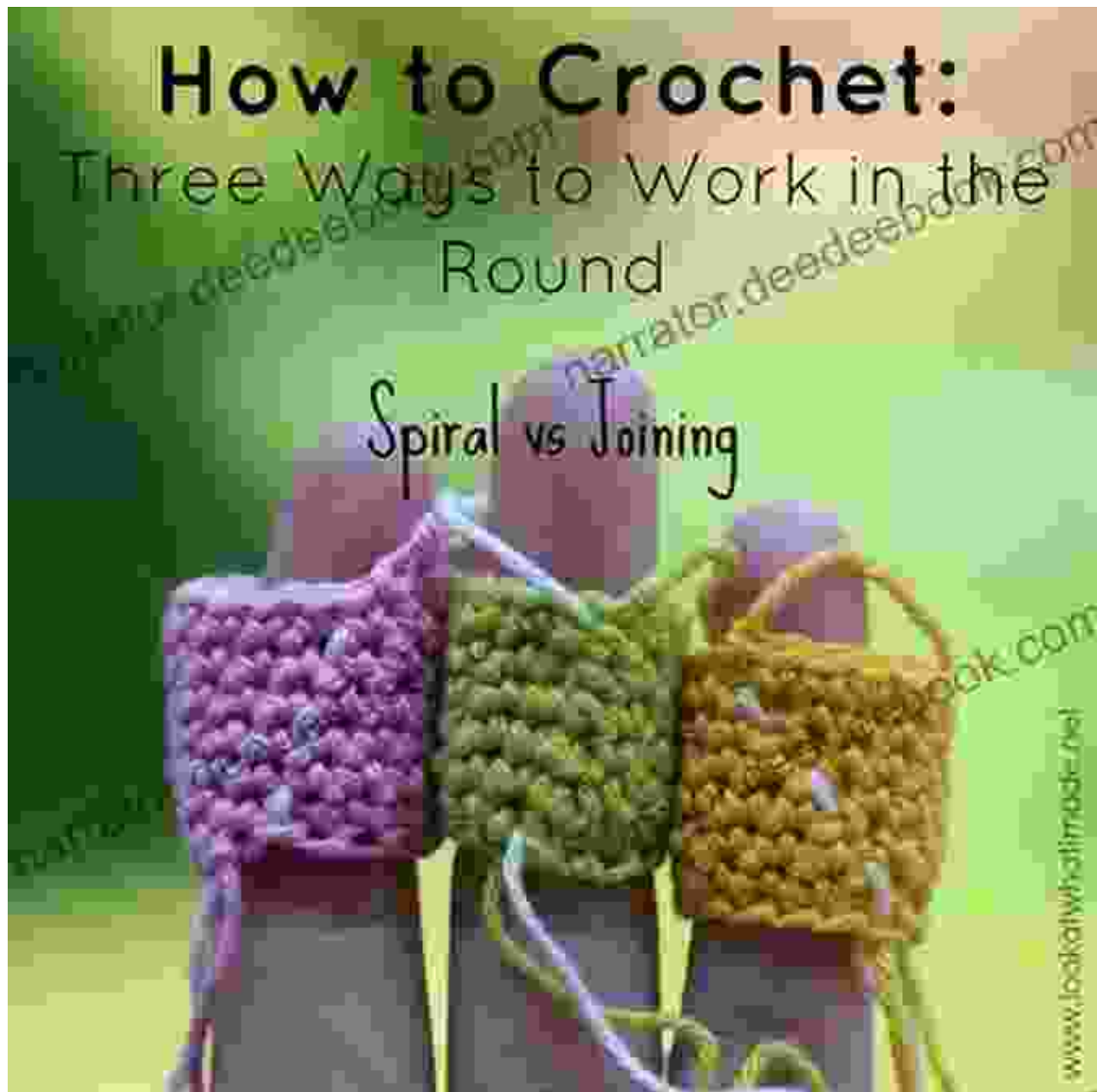


Continue around the round, alternating between groups of 3 dc separated by a ch 1 and single dc stitches in the skipped stitches.





Join the round with a sl st in the top of the first dc.



### **Continuing the Pattern**

Repeat round 2 for the desired number of rounds until your fabric reaches the desired size.

### **Tips and Tricks**

- Use a hook that is one size smaller than the recommended hook size for your yarn. This will create a tighter, more compact fabric.
- Keep your tension consistent throughout your work. This will help to create a fabric that is even and free of gaps.
- If you are making a flat piece of fabric, turn your work after each round. This will help to prevent your fabric from curling up.
- If you want to create a textured fabric, experiment with different combinations of dc and sc stitches.
- Bundle crochet can be used to create a variety of projects, such as scarves, blankets, hats, and bags. Get creative and experiment with different shapes and sizes!

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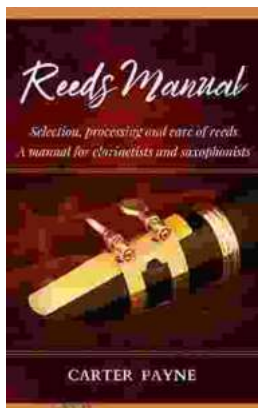
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
