




2. The War of the Roses

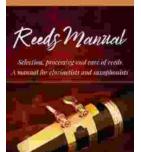
