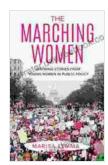

These are just a few of the many young women who are making a difference in public policy. Their stories are inspiring and remind us that we all have the power to make a difference in the world.

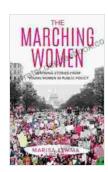
How You Can Get Involved
