Instrumentation

The symphony is scored for a large orchestra, consisting of the following instruments:

- 2 flutes
- 2 oboes
- 2 clarinets in B-flat
- 2 bassoons
- 2 horns in C
- 2 trumpets in C
- 3 trombones
- Timpani
- Strings (violins, violas, cellos, and double basses)

Historical Significance

Symphony No. 41 was composed during a period of great personal and financial turmoil for Mozart. Despite his struggles, he managed to create a work that is full of joy, optimism, and grandeur. 


